We are continuing to move our cars down our sight word speedway! In reading, we are learning strategies to find the meaning of unknown words in a text. While reading, ask your child about word in the text that they may not know. Have them share some of the strategies that they have learned, such as using picture and word clues. In science students are continuing to learn about the day and night sky for the rest of the month of December. In social studies we are finishing up learning about the difference between a good and a service and how we must make choices because we cannot purchase everything that we want. Students are learning to compare numbers in math using the terms, greater than, less than and equal to. You can practice this at home with your child by having them count two groups of objects and ask them to compare which groups is greater. Please make sure you check your child's daily folder as well as remind for announcements and information from your child's teacher. Greetings 5th Grade Families!






