This is a reminder for all of us to do our part to part to reduce the spread of illness in our schools and offices. Health officials continue to see elevated levels of respiratory illness across the

recent CDC and emergency department surveillance data, Georgia is experiencing very high levels of respiratory virus infections. They remind us that respiratory and other infections such as gastrointestinal infections can be prevented when the community takes simple but important preventive measures to limit transmission. It is important to ensure that staff and students follow the CDC and Department of Public Health recommendations below to prevent spread within our school and the community.

- **Get Vaccinated!** It is not too late to get your flu and COVID-19 vaccines. For certain individuals, RSV vaccine is also available. Contact your healthcare provider for more information on vaccines or GNR Public Health at 770-904-3717 to make an appointment.
- **Handwashing**. Wash your hands frequently with soap and water or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol if soap and water isn't available. Remember that hand sanitizer is not effective against some gastrointestinal viruses.
- Cover your cough and sneeze. Use a tissue to cover your mouth and nose when you cough and sneeze. You can use your elbow if a tissue is not available. Dispose of used tissues immediately and wash your hands.
- **Keep your distance from people that are sick.** While this is not always possible, the closer you are to an individual that is sick, the more likely you are to be exposed to respiratory droplets containing a virus.
- Stay home when you are sick. In addition to staying home when you are sick, try your best to keep your distance from others in your home to help prevent them from getting sick. Get tested and consult your medical provider. If you test positive for COVID-19, please be reminded you must isolate for a minimum of 5 days from onset of symptoms and may return after 5 days and when you have been at least 24 hours fever-free without the use of medicine.
- Clean and disinfect. When someone is sick in the home, cleaning and disinfecting frequently touched surfaces is especially important to help prevent spreading illness to other members of the home. Make sure to follow the directions on the cleaning agent including how long the cleaning agent needs to stay wet on the surfaces you are cleaning.
- Mask wearing. You may choose to wear a mask to help provide protection against circulating viruses. Masks can help protect people at higher risk of serious illness. Their effectiveness does vary depending on the virus and mask quality.

Should you have additional questions about flu, COVID-19, and RSV you can contact your medical provider or contact GNR Public Health by calling (770) 339-4260 and ask for the Epidemiologist on call.



Our school is using Beanstack this year to monitor our reading. This program allows our students to log their reading daily to earn badges and rewards. Our goal with this program is to promote an authentic love of reading.

Please remember each C.J. Hicks student is expected to read for 35 minutes. Some of this reading (about 20 minutes worth) should be done nightly at home. Please support your child's reading by making sure they meet this expectation daily.

You can help your child with logging by using the Beanstack mobile app. Directions on using it are available <u>here</u>. Students can also access Beanstack from their ClassLink login.




GREETINGS 5TH GRADE FAMILIES!




The CJH Front Office is open Monday through Friday from 7:00 am - 3:00 pm. The dedicated front office staff members look forward to assisting you throughout the school year.
